CONDITIONS OF ENTRY TO THE SHOWGROUND

THE TAREE SHOW SOCIETY IS A NON-PROFIT ORGANISATION.

ALL MONIES RAISED ARE USED TO PROVIDE AND MAINTAIN THESE FACILITIES.

Taree Showground is a designated "Glass Free" area and **NO** glass drink containers are to be brought onto the site.

The M.R.A. & H. Society Taree Inc. Committee reserves the right to search for any prohibited item including but not limited to weapons, controlled, dangerous or illegal substances, alcohol bottles and cans which may be expressly forbidden and subject to confiscation.

NO alcohol is to be consumed or carried in the Sideshow area.

No person under the legal drinking age is to attempt to purchase and / or consume any alcohol at the Showground. If of age, he or she will not consume such quantity of alcohol as would give rise to a blood reading above the legal limit allowable in the State for control of a motor vehicle, or such quantity which would adversely affect his/her ability to drive a motor vehicle, whichever is lesser.

Alcohol must **ONLY** be consumed in the designated licence area.

Drunken, unruly, offensive behaviour or fighting will result in removal from the

Showground.

The M.R.A. & H. Society Taree Inc. Committee reserves the right to refuse

admission without explanation and to eject any person whose conduct the

Committee or a member of the Committee deems disorderly, unruly, offensive or any person who is adversely affected by alcohol or otherwise behaves in a violent or threatening manner.

Any person supplying alcohol to a person under the legal drinking age will be ejected from the Showground.

Children under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.

The speed limit for vehicles within the Showground area is 10 kilometres per hour.

Any person ejected from or directed to leave the Showground is therefore banned from re-entering the Showground until such time as the Committee of the M.R.A. & H. Society (Taree) Inc. has lifted the ban. Such person shall thereafter be treated as a trespasser and Police will be notified.

- 1. All entries are to be in up to Thursday 4pm prior to the Show. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 2. Entry Fees please check entry fee on each section. Early entries would be appreciated.
- 3. Arts and Crafts Pavilion will be open to receive exhibits Starting from Wednesday/Thursday before the show from 10.00am until 4pm. No entries (Except Cooking) will be received on Friday Morning of the Show.
- 4. Exhibits to be entered in one class only.
- 5. The Pavilion will be closed for Judging on Friday. Judging to commence at 10.00am. Judges shall have the right to sample all food. Exhibits will be cut by the Judge. Judges decision is final in all sections.
- 6. The Stewards reserve the right to destroy cooking exhibits that ferment or show signs of mould after the third day.
- 7. Fruit Cakes must be in a square. Tin must not be more than 20cms in length or breadth or diameter.
- 8. No packet mixes permitted. Only in the Junior Section is packet mixes permitted.
- 9. Exhibits to be placed on paper plates & covered in cling wrap or oven bag.
- 10. Prize money will be paid at the Treasurer's Office. Any prize monies not collected within two (2) days of the Show will be returned to the funds for next year's Show.
- 11. No Exhibits to be removed from the Pavilion before 3pm Sunday 9th October, and then only with the sanction of the Section Stewards and no later than 4.30pm
- 12. All Exhibitors are reminded that whilst the Committee will take every precaution to ensure safety of the articles sent to the Exhibition yet they wish it to be distinctly understood any article lost or stolen the Committee will not be held responsible.

24a. Wool Article/Garment State Competition ENTRY FEE: FREE

Competition to be conducted at Society (Local), Group and State – Group 2 Final Judged at Taree Show.

- The winning article/garment will be sent to the 2024 Sydney Royal Easter Show for judging in the State Competition. Competition is conducted to seek excellence in the preparation and presentation of Australian wool and to promote an Australian product.
- Awards: Champion, Reserve Champion. Prize money is sponsored by AgShows NSW. Group final winning entries will receive a cash prize of \$50, and the state final winning entry will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.

CONDITIONS:

- 1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitionsapply:
- a) Garment: an item that can be worn eg. dress, jacket, scarf,hat
- b) Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home eg. blanket; with an outfit eg. bag; for amusement eg. toy; as a decoration eg. picture etc.
- c) Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique and/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket and tea cosy OR eg.
- 2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.
- 3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket and a crocheted blanket.
- 2. The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of, and contain a minimum of, 80% SHEEP wool.
- 3. Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc and must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice."
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- 6. All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show and made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eliqible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State level.
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- 10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- 11. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
- 12. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible and applicable).





AgShows NSW RICH FRUIT CAKE COOKING COMPETITION

INGREDIENTS:

250g sultanas

250 g chopped raisins

250 g currants

125 g chopped mixed peel

90 g chopped red glace cherries

90 g chopped blanched almonds

1/3 cup sherry or brandy

250 g plain flour

60 g self-raising flour

1/4 teaspoon grated nutmeg

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/2 teaspoon ground cloves

250g butter

250g soft brown sugar

½ teaspoon lemon essence OR finely grated lemon rind

½ teaspoon almond essence

½ teaspoon vanilla essence

4 large eggs.

RECOMMENDED METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the sherry or brandy. Cover and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices Cream together the butter and sugar with the essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after, each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared square 20cm x 20cm (8" x 8") tin and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ - 4 hours.

Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

Note: To ensure uniformity and depending upon the size it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.

Judges Note: The height of the cake should not exceed 5.7cm (57mm)



Section 11—Sugar Art

Prize Money: As specified in each class Judging commencing 10am Friday.

Regulations: Handwork only. No cake will be cut. Blocks, tins or suitable

material may be used in place of actual cake. Small vases or manufactured pillars are permissible. Glue must not be used as an attachment medium for sugar work in any icing and decorating classes.

Edible food may form part of board presentation for visual effects e.g. Coloured Sugar, coconut, piping gel and royal icing.

All cakes must be attached to board. Cleats must be attached to base of boards. A tier is defined as being "two or more levels, not necessarily one above the other, but linked by a common base".

All Exhibits must be bona - fide work of the exhibitor.

Cake Height Restriction is 18 Inches High.




